16-bed: recovery-oriented residential accommodations

Criteria for Admission:

- ~ Completion of residential programming or 4-6 months of recovery
- ~ Financially able to meet program fees
- ~ Engaged in work, school, training, or community activities

Unity House

A harm reduction permanent housing model for homeless and chronically homeless men with substance use disorder histories

Graduate House

A 16 single room substance-free residential housing for men in the intermediate stages of recovery
