A "short-term" residential program for women (between 18 and 65) recovering from a substance use disorder and related or co-occurring issues

WRAP House

Women's Residential Addiction program

A "long-term" residential program for women recovering from a substance use disorder and related or co-occurring issues



Monarch House



Services include

- On-site case management
- On-site staff/outside provider or peer-facilitated groups
- Development of Individualized Service Plan
- Case managers coordinating involvement with the Department of Children and Families, parole, probation, medical, mental health, and education agencies
- Referrals made to outside agencies

Treatment modalities include

- Daily living skills
- Psycho-educational groups
- Medication monitoring
- Relapse prevention
- Nutrition evaluation

Services include

- On-site case management
- Mandatory off-site self-help meetings
- Development of Individualized Service Plan
- Case managers coordinate with the Department of Children and Families, parole, probation, medical, mental health, & education entities



- Referrals are made to outside agencies for counseling, therapy, and psychiatric issues, including medical and housing providers
- Staff assists residents with obtaining placement in permanent, sustainable housing
